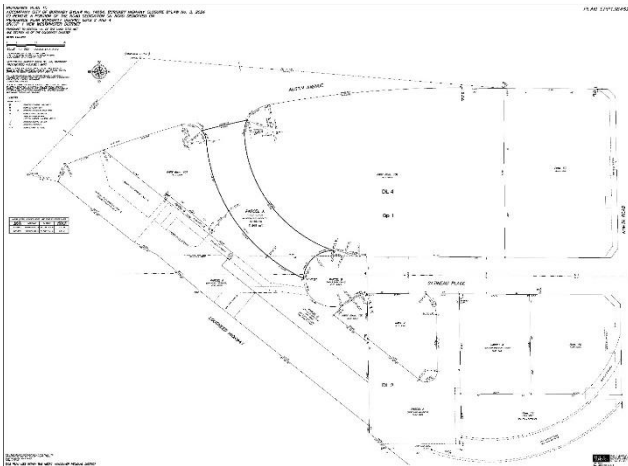

Purpose: To close certain portions of highway – closure of a portion of Gatineau Place abutting 9850 Austin Road (closure of the portion of road dedicated on Plan BCP26417 containing 1,849 m² of District Lots 2 and 4, Group 1, New Westminster District) as shown outlined in bold and identified as Parcel A on Reference Plan EPP136469, prepared by Gary Sundvick, B.C.L.S.
